Landscaping:

The Association signed a new three year contract for landscaping services for 2023 – 2025. Inflation took a significant toll on the pricing, particularly for mulch. As a result, the Board decided to adjust its mulching schedule to every other year from every year in order to keep costs down. However, the trees on the Prospect entrance mounds will be mulched every year to maintain a good appearance upon entering the development.

Repairs have been made to the gazebo steps and to the playground equipment for safety purposes, other maintenance requirements will be addressed as they arise, however, no other landscape improvement projects are on tap for the rest of the year.

Peanut Shells and Dog Droppings:

Please be advised that a number of complaints have been received about peanut shells littering both the common areas and private property, and clogging up some residents' gutters. Feeding wild animals unshelled peanuts is a significant disservice to your fellow residents. If you wish to feed the animals, please consider shelled peanuts as an alternative. The Board is working with the City Arborist to develop a long range plan for gradual replacement and upgrading of the landscaping throughout the development.
